



Rules of Behavior

To provide a quiet, pleasant environment conducive to study as well as casual use, the Board of Library Trustees has adopted policies regarding patron conduct, copies of which are available for review.

All conduct that materially disrupts the use of Library facilities, collections or services or is defined or unacceptable in this Library's environment is prohibited. Patrons are urged to report disruptive behavior immediately to staff so appropriate steps can be taken to stop it.

Examples of disruptive, unacceptable or illegal behaviors include, but are not limited to:

1. Disruptive or rowdy behavior such as loud talking, loud audio equipment (with or without headphones), talking on a cell phone, and pushing or shoving which may result in disturbing other patrons or damaging Library property.
 2. Consuming food or drinking beverages from containers without lids (except with prior approval of the Library Board of Trustees).
 3. Smoking on library premises.
 4. Possessing or using alcohol or controlled substances.
 5. Using offensive, threatening, harassing or abusive language or gestures towards library patrons or staff.
 6. Damaging, defacing or misusing library materials, equipment or facilities.
 7. Conducting surveys or distributing leaflets. Keeping patrons from entering or leaving the library. Posting notices without prior Administrative approval.
 8. Using the entrances, lobbies, walkways, restrooms, parking lot, sidewalks, lawns, or steps for purposes unrelated to visiting the Library and using its services.
 9. Parking a vehicle in the Library parking lot between 9 a.m. and 9 p.m. Monday through Saturday when not using the library.
 10. Use of sports or recreational equipment on library grounds, including, but not limited to, bicycles, skateboards, skates, and scooters or leaving such equipment in the Library entry area or lobby.
1. Patrons are expected to wear appropriate clothing which includes wearing shirts and shoes while in the Library.

The Library is not responsible for damage to or loss of unattended personal belongings.
